


Local Voices, Rio Tinto Survey

Hello to our dear Shanty friends and followers of "The Shantylillies". After more than 5 years, the Lillies have gone through a bit of a transition in recent times. The Amity was a 148-ton brig used in several notable voyages of exploration and settlement in Australia in the early nineteenth century and a replica of the Brig Amity has pride of place in our home town of Albany, Western Australia. "Rogues"...because we like to think we are a wee bit roguish!!! So, we hope you will continue to follow us and come along to our regular Folk and Shanty events here in glorious Albany.
